**Ioannis Kissonerghis** was born in Nicosia in 1889 and died in Johannesburg in 1963.

After his graduation from the Pancyprian Gymnasium, he went to Athens where he studied medicine for three years. He ended his studies to work as a volunteer doctor for the Greek Red Cross in Thessaloniki during the Balkan Wars (1912-13).

Upon his return from the war he decided not to continue his studies at the Medicine School and instead enrolled to study at the Higher School of Fines Arts in Athens. During the period of his studies he worked at the newspapers "Chronos" and "Estia" as a drawing artist. He was forced to stop his studies, just after a year and a half when he became ill with tuberculosis. He returned to Cyprus where he started working as an art teacher at the Pancyprian Gymnasium. The lack of a diploma forces him to resign from the Pancyprian Gymnasium, but he continues teaching at the English School in Nicosia from 1936 till 1952.

As an art teacher he introduced to his students the free drawing and painting from nature. He also brought his students in contact with the work of significant painters. He contributed to the evolution of Cypriot contemporary art as a painter and teacher. He is considered as one of the fathers of Cypriot contemporary art.

Besides his original painting skills, he used to copy paintings which were fashionable at that time to please the demands of urban class. He also used to paint icons. He had painted part of the central dome and semi-dome of the Holy of Holies of Phaneromeni Church in Nicosia, and the iconostasis of the Ayia Triada Church in Durban, in a realistic manner with influences from Renaissance.

He was the artist with the most participations at the annual Cypriot Artistic Exhibition, which was established by the colonial government in 1931. He took part in the exhibitions of 1931, 1932, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1937, 1938 and 1947. His first one-man exhibition was presented in 1952 at "Pnevmatiki Adelfotis" in Nicosia. The Greek Pnevmatikos Group in Cyprus organized his second one-man exhibition in 1953 at the Nicosia Club.





Andreas Chrysochos was born in Milia of Famagusta in 1929. He graduated form the College of Morphou in 1950. During the years 1952 to 1954 and 1957 to 1959 he studied painting at Goldsmith's College, School of Art of the University of London. He also studied psychology of children's art at N.E. London Polytechnic from 1974 to 1976. He worked as a teacher, art professor at the Pedagogical Teacher's Training College, Morphou and as an Art Inspector. He writes art critiques and he is involved in icon-painting and calligraphy. He has participated in many group exhibitions: in 1961 at Vayianos Gallery in Athens; in 1965 in Cairo; in 1967 in Boston U.S.A. and at the 7th Panhellenic Exhibition in Athens: in 1968 at the 7th

Biennale of Alexandria, the 1st Indian Triennale and the 34th Venice Biennale; in 1970 at the Commonwealth Institute in London and Edinburgh; in 1979 at the "Contemporary Cypriot Painting" exhibition in Thessaloniki; in 1981-1982 at the Touring Exhibition of Contemporary Cypriot Painting in Budapest, Prague, Bucharest, Belgrade and Sofia; and in 1983 at the "Contemporary Cypriot Painting" exhibition in Paris.

In 1950 he was honoured with the First International Watercolour Award in London, in 1963 he received the honorary medal in Alexandria and in 1968 he was honoured with the Grand Prix Europen des Arts et des Lettres in Nice.

#### Alexandros Alexandrakis was born in Athens in 1913.

He graduated from The School of Fine Art, Athens in 1937, having won all the major art awards; those of Portrait, Nude, Semi-nude and Composition.

His achievements are considered unique in the history of the annual prizes of the school.

Alexandrakis is an artist of international repute, having forged a strong reputation in the USA where he regularly submitted work to The Guggenheim in New York for its annual exhibition.

In 1950 he submitted two works for the design of a poster for the Marshall Plan, organised by the American Government. He won the first and second prize.

His work can be found in many public and private collections in Greece and Cyprus.

Notably at The National Gallery Greece, War Museum, Athens, The Municipality of Athens, The State Gallery of Contemporary Cypriot Art, The Leventis Gallery, The Bank of Cyprus Cultural Centre Foundation.

In Renewed Fire I & II "I wanted to use inspiration gained from Doros Partasides' powerful and moving photographs without simply redrawing them. I decided to combine his imagery with evocative figurative elements from Goya's etching 'The Sleep of Reason Produces Monsters' and De Chirico's painting 'The Mystery and Melancholy of the Street', which echo the moods of the photographs. These works have always inspired me, and I was excited by the interplay between their haunting imagery and the break and devastating settings taken from the photographs."



Taylor Garrison BELCHER, a career Foreign Service officer, was posted to Cyprus as U.S. Consul in 1957 and a year later as Consul General remaining there until 1960. Four years later President Lyndon Johnson appointed him as the United States Ambassador on Cyprus, a post he held for 5 years from 1964 to 1969.

After the eruption of violence between the Greek and Turkish Cypriots during his time in office, Belcher played an important role in reestablishing peace between the two communities. As a result of his peace-keeping abilities, he was awarded the State Department's Secretary's Distinguished Service Award.

In 1969 he left Cyprus for Peru where he was appointed ambassador by President Richard Nixon. He served as ambassador to Peru until his retirement in 1974.



**Nikos Hadjikyriakos-Ghika** was born in Athens in 1906. As a young boy Hadjikyriakos-Ghika showed an early inclination to drawing and while still at school he attended art lessons with Constantinos Parthenis.

In 1922 he moved to Paris where he studied French literature and Aesthetics at the Sorbonne. Two years later he enrolled at the Academie Ranson and studied painting under R. Bissière and etching with D. Galanis.

He first exhibited in Paris in 1923 at the Salon des Tuileries and the Salon des Surindépendants. In 1927 he held his first solo exhibition at the Galerie Percier in Paris. His first Athens exhibition was shared with sculptor Michael Tombros at the Strategopoulos Gallery in 1928. In 1930 he settled in Paris and returned to Athens four years later a respected artist.

Between 1935 and 1937 he edited the periodical 'The Third Eye' together with architect Pikionis, the poet Papatzonis and the director Karantinos.

In 1937 he restored the ancestral home of the Ghikas family in Hydra, where he painted the first works in which he expressed his artistic style decisively, combining elements of Cubism with nature, light and the architecture of Greece.

He was appointed Professor of Drawing at the National Technical University of Athens School of Architecture in 1941, and continued to teach there until 1958.

In 1961 he married Barbara Hutchinson, who had been previously married to Victor Rothschild, 3rd Baron Rothschild and to classicist Rex Warner.

In 1972 he was elected a regular member of the Academy of Athens and in 1986 an honorary member of the Royal Academy of Arts in London. He was also granted honorary doctorates by the School of Architecture at the University of Thessaloniki in 1982 and by the University of Athens School of Philosophy in 1991. More than fifty exhibitions of Hadjikyriakos-Ghika's works have been held in Athens, Paris, London, Geneva, Berlin and New York.





Yiannis Moralis was born in Arta in 1916. His family moved to Athens in 1927 and in 1931 he enrolled at The School of Fine Arts, Athens, where he studied painting under Constantinos Parthenis and Umbertos Argyros. On graduating in 1936 he received a grant to study in Rome for a year. He later moved to Paris and attended painting and fresco classes at the École des Beaux Arts and mosaic classes at the École des Arts et Métiers.

In 1939, at the start of the Second World War, Moralis returned to Greece and joined the army forces.

He first participated in an exhibition was in 1940. Numerous other exhibitions followed both nationally and internationally.

In 1947 he began teaching at The School of Fine Arts, Athens and continued to do so until his retirement in 1983.

In 1949 he formed 'Armos', a group with other artists including: Nikos Hadjikyriakos-Ghikas, Yannis Tsarouchis, Nikos Nikolaou, Nikos Engonopoulos and Panayiotis Tetsis. 'Armos' held its first exhibition in 1950 at Zappeion, Athens.


From the 1950s onwards, he moved into a geometric style incorporating curved form, moving on from the realistic figurative depictions of his early work.

Over the course of his career, Moralis was also involved in theatre sets and costume design for the Greek National Theatre and the Greek National Ballet. He also decorated architecture such as the facade of the Athens Hilton, the Metro Station 'Panepistimiou' and Athens Central Station.

He had been named Commander of the Royal Order of the Phoenix in 1965 and of the Order of Honour in 1999.



### **Nikos Engonopoulos** born in Athens in 1907.

During the summer of 1914 when Nikos Engonopoulos' family went on a trip to Constantinople. Due to the outbreak of the First World War whilst they were in Constantinople, his family were obliged to remain and settle there.

In 1923, he is enrolled as a boarder in a Lyceum in Paris, where he studied for four years.

He returns to Greece in 1927 where he is first enlisted in the 1st Infantry Battalion until 1928. After that he works as a translator at a bank and as a secretary at the University for 2 years. Then from 1930 to 1933 he works is as a designer in the Urban Planning Department of the Ministry of Public Works.

In 1932 he enrolls at The School of Fine Arts, Athens, where he studies under Konstantinos Parthenis. He also attends classes at the art studio of Fotis Kontoglou.

During that time, he met the poet Andreas Embirikos and important

artists such as Yannis Tsarouchis, Giorgio de Chirico and Yannis Moralis.

His first paintings, mostly temperas on paper, were presented at the 'Art of Modern Greek Tradition' exhibition, in January 1938. In 1939 his first collection of poems (Do Not Distract the Driver) were published, followed by a second collection the following year (The Clavicembalos of Silence).

Professor, painter, set designer and poet. Nikos Engonopoulos was one of the major representatives of the generation of the 30s and one of the main representatives of the surrealist movement in Greece. His work also includes translations, essays, and critical studies.

He took part in numerous solo and group exhibitions; he published many poem collections and there have been many books written about him.

His work can be found at several museums in Greece and abroad and in many prominent private collections.

**Nikolaos Gysis** was born in Sklavochori, Tinos in 1842. In 1850 his family moved to Athens.

Very early on in life Gysis showed an aptitude for art and even though the proper age for admission at The Athens School of Fine Arts was 12 years old, Gysis was admitted at just the age of 8 as an observer for the first four years, and as a student after that until the age of 22 (1864).

In 1865, thanks to efforts by his artist friend, Nikiforos Lytras and interest by a wealthy sponsor, Nikolaos Nazos, Gysis obtained a scholarship to attend the Munich Academy of Art where he studied under Karl von Piloty.

In 1873, Gysis returned to Athens and then toured Asia Minor

together with Nikiforos Lytras. He returned to Munich in 1874 after collecting material to further his work.

In 1880, Gysis was made an honorary member of the Academy of Fine Arts of Munich. In 1882, he received a diploma of recognition and a medal from King George I of Greece. The following year he became a professor at the Munich Academy where he attained tenure six years later. Many other honours followed.

His works can be found in museums in Greece such as the National Gallery, the Benaki and the Museum of the City of Athens, in museums in Germany such as the Neue Pinakothek, in Munich and in Australia in the National Gallery of Victoria, Melbourne and in important private collections.

### **Nikiforos Lytras** was born on the island of Tinos in 1832.

At the age of eighteen he moved to Athens to study at The School of Fine Arts under Margaritis, Triantafyllou and Thiersch. He completed his studies in 1856. Later, in 1860, on a scholarship from the Greek government he went to Munich to study at The Royal Academy of Fine Arts. There, he was taught by Karl von Piloty. During that period Lytras focused on historically themed paintings. His subjects were inspired by Greek Mythology and history.

In the summer of 1865 before returning to Greece he met Nikolaos Gysis in Munich and together they studied the masterpieces of German Museum collections.

On his return to Athens, Lytras became a professor at The Athens School of Fine Arts in the department of painting, a position he held for the remainder of his life.

Together with Nikolaos Gysis, he travelled to Asia Minor in 1873 and Paris in 1876. In 1879 he travelled to Egypt.

After returning to Greece, Lytras worked on portraiture, still life and everyday scenes. Lytra's paintings on everyday life correspond with the ideology against the ruling class at the time. His trips to Asia Minor and Egypt informed his paintings in depicting children of colour and other elements of Anatolia.

During the final period of his life he painted many scenes that explored aging, loneliness, and fear of death. From the time when he started teaching at the Athens School of Fine Arts to the time of his death in 1904, Lytras was very active in the artistic scene of Athens and is considered as the most prominent artist of that scene.

During his life he took part in numerous solo and group exhibitions, there have been countless books written about his work which can be found in most prominent museums of Greece and in many private collections.

**Pericles Pantazis** was born in Athens in 1849 and studied at The School of Fine Art, Athens under Nikiforos Lytras, between 1866 and 1871.

He continued his studies for one year at the Munich Academy of Fine Art and moved to Marseille to be taught by Gustave Courbet and Antoine Chintreuil.

In 1873 Pantazis moved to Brussels where he became a member of an anti-academic artistic group called Circle de la pâte (the circle of colour), and a member of Les XX.

In 1878 he represented Greece at The International Art Biennale

of Paris. He died in Brussels before he turned thirty-five from chronic tuberculosis.

His works can be found in many notable private and public collections such as: The Royal Museum of Fine Arts, Antwerp - Royal Museum of Fine Arts of Belgium, Brussels - Sint-Niklaas, Stedelijk Museum, Belgium - The National Gallery, Athens and The Leventis Gallery, Nicosia, Cyprus.



Manolis Calliyannis was born on the island of Lesbos in 1923 where he lived until 1940. During the Second World War he volunteered and served with The Royal Air Force and later with The Hellenic Air force.

After the war he studied architecture at The Witwatersrand University, Johannesburg between 1945 and 1948, whilst painting in his spare time. In 1948 he had his first solo exhibition in Johannesburg at The Constantia Galleries.

Following his great passion for art, in 1949 he terminated his studies and moved to Paris where he dedicated himself to painting.

His first works, influenced by the Paris movement of the time, move in the sphere of abstract expressionism. Abstract works in restrained and sober colours made his reputation in Europe and the USA.

In 1955 he regularly visited Lesbos and painted many landscapes of Greece, as well as some figurative pictures with abstractive tendencies. In 1960 he moved from Paris to a village near Nice.

In 1978 he returned to Greece and managed The Teriade Library and Museum in Lesbos.

He remained in Greece until his death in 2010.

Merab Guramovich Abramishvili was born in Tbilisi the capital of Georgia. In 1975 he attended the Tbilisi State Academy of Arts from where he graduated in 1981. The peculiar, unique style of Merab Abramishvili was born in the organic fusion of two artistic directions - Georgian fresco and Persian miniature which were introduced to him by his father, Guram Abramishvili, an expert in Georgian medieval art at the Art Museum of Georgia.

Merab took part in a scientific expedition organized to study the frescoes of the Ateni Zion temple (the Temple of the Assumption of the Virgin in the village of Ateni, near the city of Gori in Georgia, built in the 7th century). This expedition was led by Merab's father, Guram



Abramishvili, art critic and Ph.D. The expedition greatly influenced the formation of his personality. Impressed by the medieval frescoes from the Ateti Sioni Church, the artist adopted the gesso technique in his paintings. Due to his unique visual language and aesthetics, Abramishvili is recognized as one of the most original artists to emerge from the post-Soviet era who went beyond the established Soviet-era clichés. In the period of post-Soviet political instability, Abramishvili became preoccupied with mystical imagery.

His works have been exhibited as part of numerous solo and group exhibitions in both Georgia and abroad including Cyprus. His paintings can be found at the Art Museum of Georgia and National Gallery of Art in Tbilisi, the Museum Ludwig, Cologne, and private collections worldwide.



John Kiki was born in Eptakomi, Cyprus in 1943. At the age of three, his family moved to England and settled in London. In 1960, Kiki went to Camberwell School of Art in London, working extensively from life under the direction of the likes of Frank Auerbach, Patrick Procktor and Euan Uglow.

In 1964 Kiki entered The Royal Academy School, where his distinctive style first began to emerge. Abandoning working from life, he came to rely increasingly on drawings, magazine illustrations and on more expressive mediums. He paints rapidly with canvases spread out on the floor.

He insists that "the subject matter doesn't matter, there is no message". There is always the glorious paint!

Kiki enjoyed early success by participating in prestigious exhibitions such as: Young Contemporaries, Tate Gallery, London, 1967 - Royal Academy, London, 1972 - Thackeray Gallery, London, 1973 - British Painting'74, Hayward Gallery, London, 1974 and Serpentine Summer Show, Serpentine Gallery, London, 1982.

#### STUDIO OF NIKIFOROS LYTRAS

In our opinion a work by an unknown hand in the studio of the artist which may or may not have been executed under the artist's direction.

## SIGNED LOWER RIGHT: NIKIFOROS LYTRAS

The term signed and/or dated and/or inscribed means that in our opinion the signature and/or date and/or inscription are by the hand of the artist.

#### BEARS SIGNATURE LOWER RIGHT: NIKI-FOROS LYTRAS

The term bears a signature and /or date and / or inscription means that in our opinion the signature and / or inscription have been added by another hand.

#### **CONDITIONS OF SALE**

- 3. A buyer is considered the bidder who accepted the highest bid proposed by the auctioneer and to whom the lot was finally sold. Absentee bids are accepted by the auctioneer in writing or on the telephone during the sale, provided personal details of the bidder have been submitted 24 hours before the auction.
- 4. Every work is sold 'in its present state'. Cypria Auctions is not responsible for possible defects, damages or imperfections of a work or errors or misrepresentations in the description contained in the catalogue. All statements included in the auction catalogue relating to the provenance, dating, authenticity and estimate of a lot, are made to the best of its knowledge and do not imply or create ultimate responsibility or liability on the part of Cypria Auctions, its associates or employees to any third party.
- 5. A buyer can return a work within one (I) year of its purchase if it can be reasonably proved that it is a counterfeit. In such a case the buyer will be fully refunded (Hammer price plus commission but not interest). The sale will be set aside on condition that the buyer has not resold the work, it has been kept in the same condition as at the time of purchase and most importantly there was no mention in the catalogue of disputed authenticity.

- 6. Every work on sale is considered by Cypria Auctions as the bona fide property of the vendor who gives assurances that it is free of any legal or any other impediment, claim or demand by any third party.
- 7. A commission of 18% plus VAT is added to the hammer price.
